Metal and leather tiles are exciting new technological trends in residential design, however, new processes and design options in traditional tile materials provide great excitement as well.

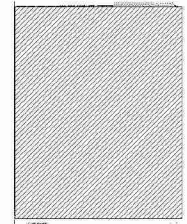
One trend worthy of note is mosaics. Some mosaics are elaborate renditions of popular nature themes while others are more

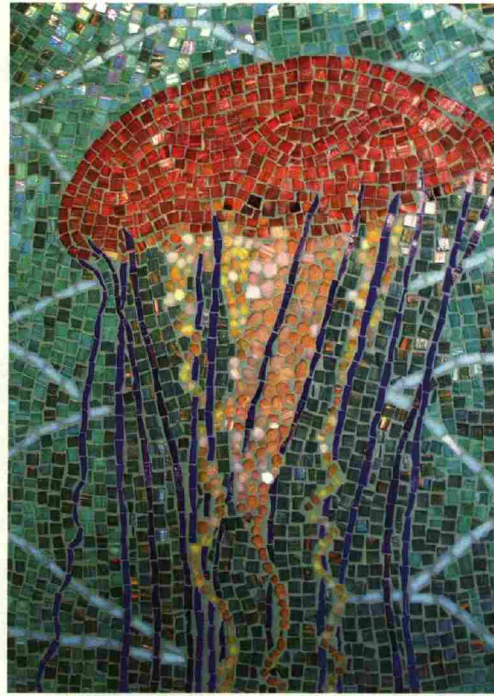
geometrically interesting. Mosaics can be found, or created, to provide an artistic, upscale alternative to wallpaper in both traditional and contemporary design.
